Passports

Passport valid for duration of stay required by all nationals referred to in chart above.

Note: As of 23 January 2007 all persons, including US citizens, travelling by air between the USA and Canada, Central and South America, the Caribbean and Bermuda are required to present a valid passport or other approved document when entering or re-entering the USA. Similar requirements for those travelling by land or sea will be introduced as early as 1 January 2008. Visas

Not required by nationals referred to in the chart above for stays of up to 30 days. Normally a one-month stamp will be issued on arrival; this can be extended by up to a further six months.
